# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

#### About the project

LINKS "Strengthening links between technologies and society for European disaster resilience" is a comprehensive study on disaster governance in Europe. In recent years, social media and crowdsourcing (SMCS) have been integrated into crisis management for improved information gathering and collaboration across European communities. The effectiveness of SMCS on European disaster resilience, however, remains unclear, the use of SMCS in disasters in different ways and under diverse conditions. In this context, the overall objective of LINKS is to strengthen links between technologies and society for improved European disaster resilience, by producing sustainable advanced learning on the use of SMCS in disasters. This is done across three complementary knowledge domains:

- Disaster Risk Perception and Vulnerability (DRPV)
- Disaster Management Processes (DMP)
- Disaster Community Technologies (DCT)

Bringing together 15 partners and 2 associated partners across Europe (Belgium, Denmark, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands) and beyond (Bosnia & Herzegovina, Japan), the project will develop a framework to understand, measure and govern SMCS for disasters. The LINKS Framework consolidates knowledge and experiences on the uses of SMCS into useful products for relevant stakeholders. It will be developed and evaluated through five practitioner-driven European cases, representing different disaster scenarios (earthquakes, flooding, industrial hazards, terrorism, drought), cutting across disaster management phases and diverse socioeconomic and cultural settings in four countries (Denmark, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands). Furthermore, LINKS sets out to create the LINKS Community, which brings together a wide variety of stakeholders, including first-responders, public authorities, civil society organizations, business communities, citizens, and researchers across Europe, dedicated to improving European disaster resilience through the use of SMCS.

#### About this deliverable

The purpose of this deliverable is to report about the established relation to identified relevant and similar networks, institutions and communities which may become part of the LINKS Community until month 30.

This collection has been embedded in the LINKS Community Center (LCC) where in addition to a short description in-depth information about these entities is made available via the provided links to their websites, Facebook and Twitter accounts.

The networks, institutions and communities are categorized as those acting on an international scale – including the ongoing projects in the Disaster-Resilient Societies (DRS) clusters DRS01, DRS02 and the Prepare Cluster – and those active in the case countries.





While the international ones are meant as the main addressees for LINKS' dissemination, exploitation and communication activities, the national ones have been collected as support for the different case teams in their research activities in the LINKS cases.

The collection serves as a support tool for the Dissemination, Exploitation and Communication activities of the LINKS consortium. Furthermore, some of the entities could also be invited to participate in research.

The inclusion of the collection into the LCC is also meant as a service for the LINKS Community when considering the relation to other actors in the Disaster Management arena when developing their own Social Media Strategy.

After an explanation of the purpose and methodological approach used in the collection of the networks, institutions and communities the current contacts established with these entities by the consortium members are described.

Finally, an outlook is given for the further use of the "Collection of Networks".

# 1. INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Purpose of the first report

The purpose of this deliverable is to report about the collection and the established relation of similar and relevant networks, institutions and communities for LINKS in month 30.

In the context of this deliverable the generic term "Network" has been expanded to allow addressing all the target audiences of LINKS as follows:

- **Institutions** can be considered as institutional networks<sup>2</sup> if they are members of a network that aims to promote cooperation and exchange among its partners on various topics of common interest. The European Commission for example is an institution of the European Union.
- Communities can be considered as personal networks<sup>3</sup> if composed of people who share some common interests, values, or goals and who communicate regularly with each other. Various examples can be found in the Civil Society, e.g. Virtual Operation Support Teams (VOST).
- Relevant networks, institutions and communities are those which could disseminate the project's results and/or allow at a later stage the identification of similar areas of interest and common goals. It is foreseen based on this, to establish integration points on a conceptual level and to identify and use potential synergies.
- Similar networks, institutions and communities are those similar to the planned LINKS Community, namely entities of individuals with expertise in Disaster Management who share a similar interest in the use of Social Media and Crowdsourcing (SMCS). These could become a heterogenous community of practitioners, researchers, policy makers, as well as representatives from businesses and civil society.

In month 10, a completion of a list of similar networks mentioned in the Description of Action (DoA) started and was continuously extended.

For target groups defined in D8.1 (Philpot, J. & Reuge, E.; 2020) and slightly amended in D9.4 (Opromolla, A., Jagarnathsingh, A.; 2021) a distinction is made between networks working on an European scale and those which are predominantly acting on a national scale in the 4 "case-countries" Denmark, Germany, Italy, and The Netherlands.

Having in mind the different types of large-scale incidents requiring scenario specific specialized intervention forces, a sub-division of the **practitioners'** networks, institutions and communities from police, fire brigade, emergency medical services, various types of technical rescue, and NGOs involved in disaster management is considered helpful for reaching out to them when their expertise is required by the different cases.



Besides the European and some national researchers' networks, institutions and communities, also ongoing EU research projects dealing with Disaster Management in a broader sense are considered useful for the identification of relevant *developers'* networks and representatives.



In addition to the relevant European directorates (DGs) the different administrative levels of public authorities in the 4 'case-countries' are identified as *policy and decision makers* and potential addressees of the project results, because of their role in the disaster management process. Civil protection units have a double role, namely practitioner and policy and decision maker.



Besides SMEs providing Information Technology solutions, insurance companies and critical infrastructure companies, which are often vulnerable to the effects of disasters, are relevant for the collected **businesses** networks, institutions and communities.



In the *civil society* networks and communities special attention is given to those vulnerable groups with communication difficulties, e.g., people with visual or hearing impairment. Religious minorities are mentioned too, which are at risk to become a target for terrorist attacks (German case). But also, the digital volunteers are considered as they could give valuable support in crisis situations.



While several print media providing information about disaster management and/or civil protection are available, one can hardly find **disseminators** networks with such a focus. Nevertheless, the resources listed in this sub-section could become important for LINKS' dissemination activities once the LINKS products have reached full maturity in 2023.

While building the LINKS Community is the main purpose of the collection of networks, institutions and communities, the national networks collection also intends

- to support the research and dissemination, exploitation, and communication (DEC) activities in the 5 cases and,
- for external users of the LCC in the case countries, to consider networks, institutions and communities which may be important for an effective communication strategy for different crisis scenarios.

Additionally, this information will be included in Task 7.4 and in the quality assurance methodology as well as the community building strategy.

### 1.2 Reading guide

The status of the established contacts is represented in tables either

- by specific profession for the international networks, institutions and communities
  - o for example, fire service, disaster management, crisis management etc.,
- by LINKS' target audience for the national networks, institutions and communities
  - for example, practitioner, researcher, civil society, etc.

The contacts are categorized as follows

- INFORMED
  - networks, institutions and communities to which the LINKS project and results have been communicated and disseminated to, but who do not currently have an active role in the project. This could be via social media coms, or the newsletter, media entities, etc.
- PARTICIPATED
  - networks, institutions and communities that have been invited to participate to in research activities in the project during this period, for informing and validating the project results. This could be as participants in interviews, surveys, LINKS Community Workshops (and other workshops), focus groups or other research activities.
- EXPLOITING
  - networks, institutions and communities which are currently exploiting or expected to exploit the project results

Finally, the column COMMENT includes a short description of the activity and/or reason for contacting the networks, institutions and communities.

  - Furthermore, the national collection is also meant as a tool for further external users of LINKS. When drafting their own SMCS strategies in the case countries they would have to consider all actors in the crisis management arena which may be actively using Social Media

#### 2.5 Civil Society networks and communities

- The increased information flow through the various social media channels results in an increased challenge for the Disaster Management Organizations (DMO) to get a situational picture during a disaster. Information provided by Civil Society networks can provide valuable input.
  - The needs of vulnerable groups are very seldom considered by DMOs in their Social Media Strategy.



- There are very promising Citizens and Science initiatives underway which take advantage of the information gathered from the crowd.
- Digital volunteers will become a very important support for DMOs handling this information. They can help manage the challenge of information overload and take advantage of the available information, especially pictures and videos from the incident sites.

Other projects dealing with disaster technology or strategies for handling pandemics could be very interesting for some members of the Links Community while others may mainly be interested in projects dealing with the social-cultural aspects.

As the contact with cluster projects are managed by the lead of WP1 and WP9 the approach of activity reporting with the contact tables is not meaningful.

#### 4.1 DRS-01 Cluster

DRS-01 Cluster is the group of projects funded under Horizon 2020 - Call DRS (Disaster Resilience Societies) 01, which have in common the focus on secure societies, and in particular on the human factors, and social, societal, and organizational aspects of disaster-resilient societies. To create a more sustainable and bigger impact, the projects decided to share their ideas, results, lessons learned and progress. Furthermore, they were able to form working groups on different cross-cutting topics, up to in the next future, and prepare policy recommendations. These objectives are of such paramount importance that the DRS-01 Cluster is endorsed by REA.

Besides LINKS, the other EU projects part of the Cluster are:

- BUILDERS (Building European Communities' Resilience and Social Capital)
- CORE (Science& Human Factor for Resilient Society)
- ENGAGE (Engage Society for Risk Awareness and Resilience)
- RESILOC (Resilient Europe and Societies by Innovating Local Communities)
- RISKPACC (Risk Perception Action Gap)

Many dissemination and communication activities have been conducted by this Cluster. Among them:

- joint participation to the International Day of Disaster Risk Reduction 2020 and 2021 through a joint social media campaign;
- joint organization of the 1st DRS-01 Cluster Mini-Conference (4 February 2021);
- joint participation to the European Forum for Disaster Risk Reduction 2021, organized by the United Nations for Disaster Risk Reduction in November 2021 in the session "Strengthening





disaster risk governance at local level: enhancing information exchanges through new technologies and assessment models";

• joint participation to the event organized by CERIS (Community of European Research and Innovation for Security) in March 2022.

#### 4.2 DRS-02 CLUSTER

The DRS02 Cluster is a group of projects funded by the Horizon 2020 programme of the European Union under the topic SU-DRS02-2018-2019-2020 – Technologies for first responders. These projects are focused on the needs of Fire & Rescue Services, an important target audience for LINKS, but are not connected with the LINKS project. Nevertheless, they have been collected and included in the LINKS community center because they are considered as similar networks and could be motivated to become active LINKS community members in the future.

At the current maturity of LINKS' products, direct contacts to the DRS-02 cluster projects were not considered as purposeful and were limited to the CERIS events.

#### 4.3 Cluster PREPARE

Most of the projects working together in the cluster PREPARE (PREparedness and resPonse for emergency situAtions in euRopE) are addressing the needs of the Health Sector in the light of managing the COVID-19 pandemic. Like LINKS they are looking at crisis management having their focus on the preparedness and response phases. Through mutual support, the cluster is aiming at strengthening the response to the ongoing crisis and be better prepared for future health crises. LINKS attended some of the cluster meetings.

#### 4.4 Takeaways from the cooperation with other EU-projects

- Various cooperation activities have been performed in the DRS-01 cluster
- Projects of the DRS-02 cluster are considered as a source of valuable information for the Fire & Rescue Services
- The PREPARE cluster will give insight in crisis management activities necessary to strengthen the response to a health crisis





# 5. CONCLUSION AND FURTHER INTERACTION WITH NETWORKS, INSTITUTIONS AND COMMUNITIES

The present deliverable reports on the established relations with relevant networks, institutions and communities on international level. For the four case countries Denmark, Germany, Italy and Netherlands a similar collection has been done to support the case teams which have used it to a certain extent.

The number of contacts for information about the project, inclusion into the ongoing research activities or the exploitation of results represent the established relations in month 30 of the project.

Next, all the relevant networks, institutions and communities which have shown interest will be contacted and informed about the products developed in LINKS which have a full maturity level.

We expect that similar areas of interest and common goals can be identified. Based on this, hopefully integration points on a conceptual level will be established to identify and use potential synergies.
